▶ My Agency/Department/Organization

- The Winona County Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention (ASAP) is a program that is funded and operated under a Drug Free Communities grant from the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA)
- Winona Health is the local fiscal agent for ASAP
- ASAP has been operational since 2015

▶ My Role

- The Program Director is responsible for the operation and oversight of ASAP, including the Program Coordinator
- The Program Director is a resource for the Winona community



▶ Relationship to Criminal Justice System

- The mission of the ASAP program is to work together to create a culture free from the misuse of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs for our youth through community-wide collaboration
- Many initiatives are offered every year from the ASAP program, including but not limited to: Hidden in Plain Sight, the “Buzzkill” campaign, after prom events, the “Sticker Shock” campaign, Responsible Beverage Server training, community listening sessions, the “Reality Check” marijuana campaign and safe prescription drug disposal/prescription take back days
- ASAP represents a collaborative effort of community stakeholders working together to break the cycle of substance abuse among area youth
- Monthly coalition meetings are open to the public and held virtually from 2:30pm – 4:00pm on the third Monday of each month
