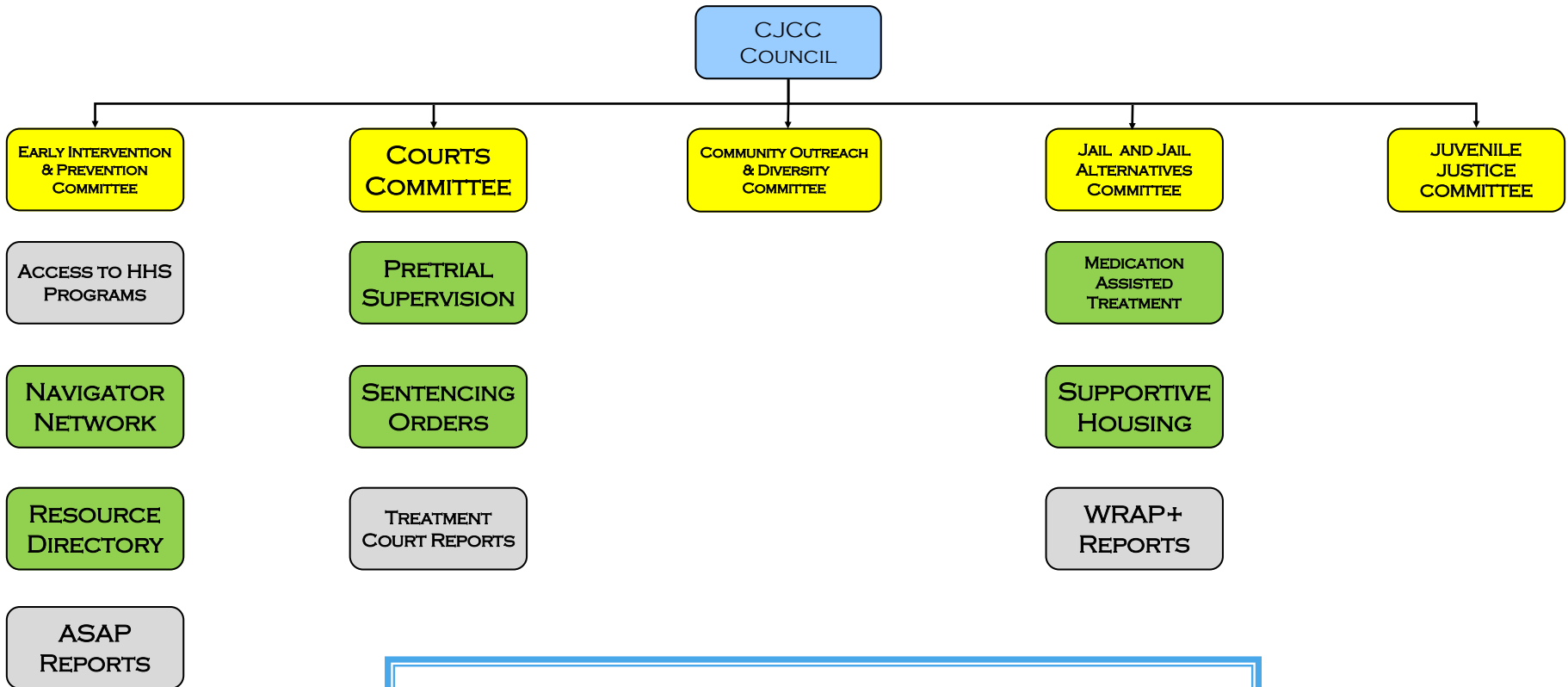
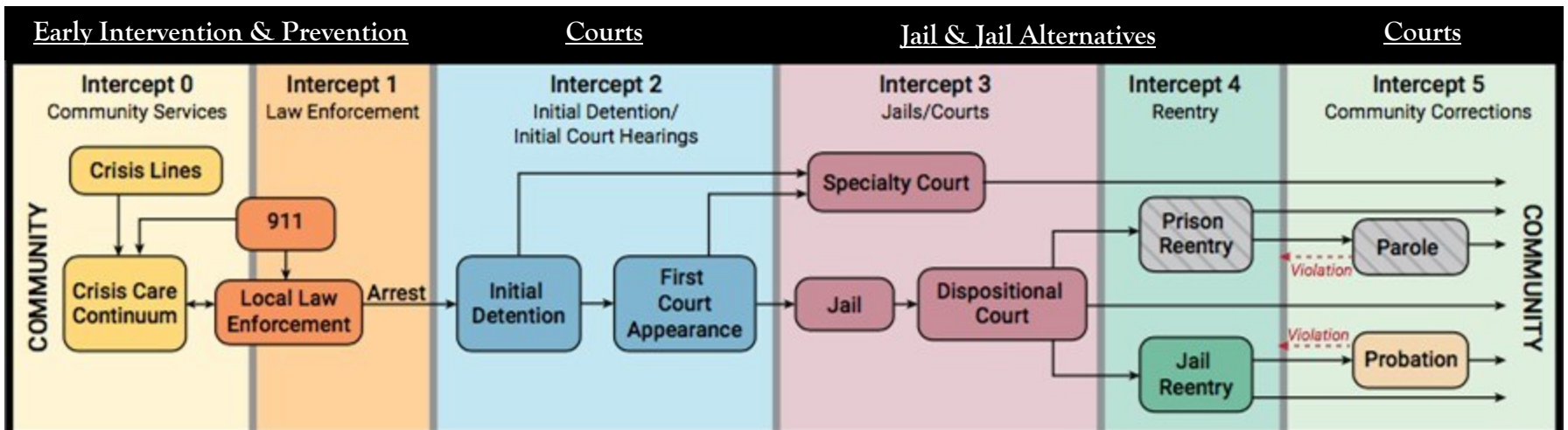


# CJCC COMMITTEE & WORKGROUP STRUCTURE

## CJCC COMMITTEE & WORKGROUP CHARGES UPDATED 11/14/21

**CJCC Council (Chair Karin Sonneman):** The CJCC Council is a policy-making council which meets on a monthly basis to consider and make recommendations based upon the work of the Council's committees and workgroups.

**Ad Hoc Committees:** The CJCC has ad-hoc committees that meet on an as-needed basis to address issues or concerns that arise that are not handled through the standing committees.

**Standing Committees & Workgroups:** The CJCC has five standing committees that meet on a monthly basis to discuss issues related to that committee's charge. The work of each committee is reported to and acted upon (as needed) by the CJCC Council. Each standing committee can have one or more workgroups, comprised of relevant stakeholders regarding that issue, who meet on an as-needed basis to recommend changes/improvements to the governing standing committee. Each standing committee may receive reports from or serve as an oversight committee for an existing justice-related programs or services and, as such, receives regular reports on the work of that program at the monthly committee meeting. The standing committees, workgroup and oversight responsibilities of each committee, as of the above date, are as follows:

- **Early Intervention & Prevention (Co-Chairs: Andy Kranz & Chris Meyer):** To research, evaluate and recommend community-based programming and services designed to prevent individuals from entering the criminal justice system.
  - Reports from Health & Human Services Advisory Subcommittee (Co-chairs: Chris Meyer & Andy Kranz): Improve access to county health and human services programs and services.
  - Workgroup (Chair: Rachel Stoll): Create a "Navigator Network" to connect persons who help others navigate systems and access services so they can share resources and ideas.
  - Workgroup (Chair: Andy Kranz): Improve methods/ways to inform the community about available resources (i.e. resource directory/apps).
  - Reports from Winona County Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention.
- **Courts (Chair: Judge Nancy Buytendorp):** The Courts Committee will search for strategies and procedures that will enable the courts to function more effectively and at reasonable cost to the taxpayer while upholding due process and the rule of law.
  - Workgroup (Chair: Judge Nancy Buytendorp): Improve pretrial supervision/monitoring of release conditions.
  - Workgroup (Chair: Judge Nancy Buytendorp): Improve accuracy and communication regarding sentencing orders.
  - Reports from Treatment Courts (Treatment Court of Winona County and Veteran's Treatment Court)
- **Community Outreach & Diversity (Chair: Karin Sonneman):** To educate the public about initiatives, programs and services supported by the CJCC; to build an atmosphere of respect and inclusion toward the criminal justice system regardless of culture or background; to identify community concerns that are related to the responsibilities of the CJCC and to prepare a detailed, proactive public relations plan to address those concerns.
- **Jail & Jail Alternatives (Chair: Justin Green):** The Committee will recommend alternatives to incarceration for the criminal justice system to consider. The Committee will research, evaluate and recommend programming designed to facilitate change in the individual and thus prevent future involvement in the criminal justice process.
  - Workgroup (Chair: TBA): Expand local delivery of MAT (Medication Assisted Treatment).
  - Workgroup (Co-chairs: TBA): Expand local supportive housing options.
  - Reports from Winona County Reentry Assistance Program Plus (WRAP+).
- **Juvenile Justice (Chair: Rebecca Church):** To encourage an effective juvenile justice system that promotes the well-being of youth while holding youth accountable for their actions and promoting public safety.
