TREATMENT COURT OF WINONA COUNTY

Objectives and Goals

- Provide all eligible participants an opportunity to participate in the Treatment Court of Winona County.
- Reduce recidivism of high risk prison or jail bound chemically dependent offenders.
- Reduce costs to the criminal justice system and the local/statewide community.
- Divert repeat chemically dependent felony offenders from incarceration by placing them on intense supervision.
- Establish a systemic response to Winona County's most severe, high risk and high need population; thus yielding a safer community.

Eligibility Criteria

- Winona County residents who are 18 years of age or older.
- Applicant must be adjudicated guilty of a felony-level offense before entering the program.
- Must not have violent past or current offenses against them.

Services

- Intensive probation supervision.
- Chemical dependency treatment and mental health, family, and other counseling.
- Random drug and alcohol testing.
- Case management.
- Improvement of community function in the areas of employment, education/training, and housing.

Incentives & Sanctions

Participants will be rewarded for progress in Treatment Court. Examples of incentives include:

- Verbal Praise and Recognition
- Awards or Certificates
- Decreased or Waived Fees/Fines
- Decreased Drug and Alcohol Testing Frequency
- Decreased Community Work Service Hours

Participants will also be disciplined if there is negative behavior. Examples of sanctions include:

- Increased Drug and Alcohol Testing Frequency
- Judicial Reviews
- Probation Meetings
- Additional Community Work
 Service Hours
- County Jail Time
- Termination
